CAROLINA RETURNS HOME TO FACE LOUISVILLE

North Carolina looks to extend a seven-game win streak over non-conference opponents when it welcomes Louisville of the Big East Conference to Kenan Stadium on Saturday, Oct. 8. The game will be televised by ESPN2 at noon.

The Tar Heels are coming off an impressive 35-20 victory at East Carolina last Saturday. Quarterback Bryn Renner completed 13 of 20 pass attempts for 230 yards and became the first UNC player to throw for four touchdowns in a game since Darian Durant in 2003. All-conference candidate Dwight Jones hauled in two of those scoring throws, including a 47 yarder which he tipped to himself and a one-handed grab in the corner of the end zone in the fourth quarter. Tailback Giovani Bernard had his third straight 100-yard rushing game with 146 yards on a career-high 24 carries and a touchdown. The Tar Heels built a 28-3 halftime lead and cruised from that point, improving to 11-2-1 against the Pirates.

Louisville is coming off a 17-13 home loss to Marshall. The Cardinals are 2-2 overall with wins over Murray State and at Kentucky.

The Louisville series was quickly scheduled last year after Tennessee pulled out of a home-and-home series with the Tar Heels. Carolina will travel to Louisville next season. This is just the sixth meeting with Louisville in a series the Cardinals lead, 3-2. Louisville has won the two most recent outings, including a 34-0 victory in 2004 and a 69-14 win in 2005. In each of those seasons, Louisville finished in the Top 20, including a No. 6 ranking in 2004.

Louisville is the second Big East team the Tar Heels have faced this season. Earlier this season, Carolina defeated Rutgers, 24-22, in Chapel Hill. This is the 10th straight season UNC has faced a Big East opponent. Since 2002, Carolina has played 15 games against Big East teams and is 6-9 in those contests.

QUICK HITS

◆ Carolina has not allowed a first quarter touchdown this season, outscoring opponents 42-3.

◆ Carolina is seeking its eighth straight win over a non-conference opponent. The Tar Heels have not lost to a team outside the ACC since the 2010 opener vs. LSU. UNC is 15-3 since 2008 against non-conference teams.

◆ A year after going just 3-3 at Kenan Stadium, the Tar Heels have already matched that win total with wins over James Madison, Rutgers and Virginia in Chapel Hill. The Tar Heels are seeking their first 4-0 start at Kenan since 1997.

◆ Redshirt freshman tailback Giovani Bernard has scored seven rushing touchdowns through five games. Last season, Johnny White led the team with seven rushing touchdowns.

◆ Bernard leads all freshman runners in the country with 109.6 yards per game. Overall, he ranks third in the league and 19th in the country.

◆ Bernard has rushed for 100 yards in three straight games. He is the first UNC player to do so since Natrone Means in 1992. The last player to rush for more than 100 yards in four straight games was Ethan Horton in 1984 who accomplished the feat in five straight.

◆ WR Dwight Jones has had at least five receptions in eight straight games, including 11 of the last 13. Jones is third in the ACC in recep-

tions per game (6.6) and second in receiving yards per game (102.8).

◆ QB Bryn Renner is second in the league in pass efficiency at 179.1. He is 87 of 115 (75.7 pct.) for 1,127 yards and 11 touchdowns.

◆ Ryan Houston, a native of Charlotte, N.C., has scored 20 touchdowns in his last 30 games. He is in second place among all active ACC runners in career touchdowns with 21.

◆ Carolina's net punting is 37.6 yards, compared with last year's 31.8. Walk-on punter Thomas Hibbard is averaging 39.9 yards per punt.

◆ Carolina has scored on 15 of 18 opportunities in the red zone. All 15 were touchdowns. The three chances UNC did not convert were a fourth down stop at the 2-yard line at ECU, a fumble at the 2-yard line vs. Virginia and a victory formation at the end of the Rutgers game. In 18 trips in the red zone, UNC's opponents have scored just seven touchdowns.

◆ Durham, N.C., native T.J. Thorpe leads the ACC with a 26.9 kickoff return average.

◆ Quinton Coples is a 2011 preseason All-America by several media outlets. Coples has 2.5 sacks this year and is sixth in the country among active players with 19.0 career sacks. Last year, he ranked third in the ACC and 16th in the country in sacks (10.0).

A WIN OVER LOUISVILLE WOULD...

- Improve Carolina to 5-1 for the first time since 2008.
- Improve Carolina's record against Louisville to 3-3 and would be Carolina's first win in the series since 1996.
- Improve Carolina's record at home to 4-0 for the first time since 1997. Last year the Tar Heels were 3-3 at Kenan Stadium.
- Be Carolina's eighth straight win over a non-conference opponent. The last time Carolina lost to a non-conference opponent was LSU to start the 2010 season. Since 2008, UNC is 15-3 against non-conference teams.

UNC-LOUISVILLE SERIES NOTES

- Carolina and Louisville first played in 1988. Louisville won that game, 38-34, in Chapel Hill.
- The two teams played a home-and-home series in 1995 and 1996. The Tar Heels won both of those contests. The series was renewed in 2004 and 2005 with Louisville winning both of those games. In 2005, Carolina lost at Louisville, 69-14. That is school record for points by an opponent.

UNC-LOUISVILLE CONNECTIONS

- North Carolina interim head coach Everett Withers was Louisville's defensive coordinator from 1995-97. During that time, he faced the Tar Heels on two occasions. In 1995, Carolina defeated the Cardinals in front of an ESPN Thursday night audience when Mike Thomas connected with Octavus Barnes with 14 seconds remaining to take a 17-10 win. The following year, Carolina beat Louisville, 28-10 in Chapel Hill.
- UNC defensive coordinator Art Kaufman was on the same staff with Louisville head coach Charlie Strong at Mississippi in 1990.
- UNC offensive coordinator John Shoop and Louisville defensive coordinator Vance Bedford coached together on the Chicago Bears' staff from 1999-2003.

WITHERS IN FIRST SEASON AS HEAD COACH

North Carolina named Everett Withers the interim head coach on July 28th to replace Butch Davis just six weeks before the season began. He earned his first win as a head coach with a 42-10 victory over JMU.

Withers is the first African-American head football coach in UNC history and only the fourth in ACC history. The others are Jim Caldwell, Wake Forest (1993-2000), Randy Shannon, Miami (2007-10) and Mike London, Virginia (2010-present).

This is the first head coaching job for Withers, who is in his 26th season as a coach. The Charlotte, N.C., native played football for Mack Brown at Appalachian State and has coached collegiately at Texas and Louisville as well as for the NFL's Tennessee Titans among other destinations. Withers was hired as UNC's defensive coordinator in 2008 and the Tar Heels consistently had one of the league's top defenses in his tenure. He relinquished his role as defensive coordinator to linebackers coach Art Kaufman, and filled his staff with the hiring of safeties coach Steve Sisa.

GIO STORM: BERNARD BREAKS OUT

• Redshirt freshman Giovani Bernard leads the team with 548 yards on 78 carries and is averaging 109.6 yards per game. He is averaging 7.0 yards per carry and has seven rushing touchdowns. He also has 16 receptions for 108 yards.

• Bernard leads all freshmen runners in the country with 109.6 yards per game. Overall, he ranks third in the league and 19th in the country in rushing.

• Bernard rushed for 146 yards on a career-high 24 carries in a 35-20 win over East Carolina. He became the first UNC player to rush for 100 yards in three straight games since Natrone Means in 1992. Bernard had 102 vs. Virginia (Sept. 17) and 155 at Georgia Tech (Sept. 24).

• Bernard has scored seven rushing touchdowns through five games this season. Last year, Johnny White led the team with seven rushing touchdowns while playing in nine games (missed the final four with injury). The last Tar Heel to rush for more than seven touchdowns in a season was Ryan Houston with nine in 2009.

• Bernard has scored two touchdowns in three different games this season. He had two in each game vs. James Madison, vs. Rutgers and at Georgia Tech.

• Bernard had a career-high 155 rushing yards on 17 carries in the loss at Georgia Tech. He scored on a 4-yard run on Carolina's opening drive and had a 55-yard TD run to tie the score in the fourth quarter. The 155 yards are the most by a UNC freshman in a game since Ronnie McGill had 244 vs. Wake Forest in 2003.

• Since 2000 (12 years), the only UNC players to run for more yards in a single-game are Willie Parker in 2000, Ronnie McGill in 2003, Chad Scott in 2004, Jacque Lewis in 2004, Ryan Houston in 2009, Shaun Draughn in 2010 and Johnny White in 2010.

• Bernard rushed for 102 yards on just 12 carries in Carolina's 28-17 win over Virginia. He averaged 8.5 yards per carry. He also caught five passes for 31 yards. Bernard became the first freshman to rush for 100 yards in a game since Greg Little vs. Duke in 2007.

• Bernard scored rushing touchdowns of 12 and 14 yards against James Madison. He is the first UNC tailback to score two touchdowns of 10-or-more rushing yards in a single game since Jonathan Linton in 1995 vs. Maryland (13 and 22). He also became the first Carolina freshman to score two rushing touchdowns in a game since Anthony Elzy against James Madison in 2007.

• A highly-touted recruit from Davie, Fla., Bernard attended football power St. Thomas Aquinas High School and led the team to back-to-back 5A state titles as a sophomore and junior. He tore his ACL on the third day of UNC's 2010 fall training camp and missed the entire season. In this year's training camp, Bernard suffered a non-displaced fracture of his left hand in a scrimmage on Aug. 15. The injury was not considered serious and he immediately returned to practice.

• Bernard's brother Yvenson was an all-conference running back at Oregon State and currently plays in the CFL.

RENNER COMPLETING MORE THAN 75 PERCENT OF HIS ATTEMPTS

• Quarterback Bryn Renner has completed 75.7 percent of his attempts this season and has a pass efficiency of 179.1. He is 87 for 115 for 1,127 yards and 11 touchdowns.

• Renner completed 13 of 20 pass attempts for 230 yards and a career-high four touchdowns in the win at East Carolina. He is the first Tar Heel quarterback to throw four touchdowns in a game since Darian Durant vs. Syracuse in 2003.

• The West Springfield, Va., native completed 15 of 21 pass attempts for 143 yards and two touchdowns in a 28-17 win over Virginia. He completed 20 of 26 passes for 273 yards, one touchdown and

three interceptions in the win over Rutgers. In his first career start vs. JMU, he completed 22 of 23 attempts for 277 yards. In that game, he threw two touchdown passes, both to Dwight Jones, and rushed for another. His only pass not completed was an interception in the second quarter. The touchdowns were the first of his college career (both rushing and passing).

- Renner’s pass completion percentage of .957 vs. JMU is the second-best in NCAA history for a player with 20 to 29 attempts. Tennessee’s Tee Martin completed 23 of 24 for .958 against South Carolina on October 31, 1998.
- Renner’s completion percentage broke the previous UNC record of .810 set by Scott Stankavage vs. William and Mary in 1983. Stankavage completed 17 of 21 that day.
- Renner’s pass efficiency rating vs. JMU was 216.8.
- Waiting behind T.J. Yates the last two seasons, Renner entered the year with just two career pass attempts. He was a SuperPrep All-America signal-caller at West Springfield High School in Virginia where threw for 3,123 yards and 35 touchdowns as a senior. Renner played for his father, Bill, a former NFL punter for the Green Bay Packers. Bill Renner is now the head coach at East Chapel Hill High School.
- Renner is backed up by junior Braden Hanson and freshman Marquise Williams. Hanson, a native of Charlotte, N.C., has appeared in four games (three in 2009, one in 2010) and has attempted just six career passes. Williams enrolled at UNC in January and participated in spring workouts.
- Renner also played in 15 games on the UNC baseball team in 2010 as a first baseman/designated hitter and had three hits.

RENNER SETS RECORDS IN EACH OF FIRST TWO WEEKS

- Quarterback Bryn Renner set a record in each of his first two career starts. He completed his first five pass attempts against Rutgers, establishing a school record for consecutive completions with 19 (14 vs. JMU, five vs. Rutgers). Renner matched the record of 15 set by Darian Durant in 2001 with a 7-yard completion to Christian Wilson on the first play of the game. He broke the record later on the first drive with a 5-yard completion to Erik Highsmith. His 17th-straight completion was a 66-yard touchdown strike to Dwight Jones. He completed his next two before the streak ended with an interception.
- In the first week of the season, Renner completed 22 of 23 attempts for 277 yards. Renner’s completion percentage of .957 is the highest in Atlantic Coast Conference single-game history for a passer with at least 20 attempts. The previous mark for a passer with 20-29 attempts was .920 by Terry Jordan of NC State against the Tar Heels in 1992 (Jordan was 23 of 25).

NOTING THE TAR HEELS

- Wide receiver Erik Highsmith returned to the lineup vs. ECU and had three catches for 94 yards, including a 75-yard touchdown reception from Bryn Renner in the first quarter. It was the longest reception of Highsmith’s career. The previous week Highsmith missed the Georgia Tech game with an ankle injury.
- Junior tight end Nelson Hurst made the biggest reception of his Carolina career with a 24-yard catch on 4th-and-1 in the third quarter of Carolina’s win at East Carolina.
- Freshman tight end Eric Ebron scored his first career touchdown on a 20-yard reception from Bryn Renner on the first play of the third quarter at Georgia Tech. Ebron had just one career catch entering the game. He finished the game with two receptions for 44 yards.
- Quarterback Bryn Renner was just 4 of 9 for 36 yards and one interception and one fumble in the first half in Atlanta. On the opening two drives of the second half, he completed 8 of 9 attempts for 113 yards and two touchdowns. The lone incomplection was a dropped pass.
- Sophomore cornerback Tre Boston recovered a fumble and intercepted a pass in the first half against Georgia Tech. It was the first interception of the season for Boston and the second of his career. Boston is third on the team with 23 tackles and leads the team with two pass breakups.
- Junior linebacker Kevin Reddick leads the team with 33 tackles and 4.5 tackles for losses.

WINNING THE FIRST QUARTER, FIRST HALF

- The Tar Heels have not allowed a first quarter touchdown this season, outscoring opponents, 42-3, in the opening quarter. Georgia Tech’s field goal in the fourth game of the season was the only score UNC has allowed in the first quarter. In the first quarter this year, Carolina outscored ECU 14-0, Georgia Tech 7-3, Rutgers 7-0 and James Madison 14-0. Neither Carolina or Virginia scored in the first quarter.
- In the first half this year, Carolina is outscoring opponents, 94-42. Carolina’s 25-point halftime lead (28-3) at ECU was the largest for the Tar Heels since a 42-7 lead at halftime of the Georgia Southern game in 2009.

TAR HEELS AMONG NATIONAL LEADERS IN TRUE FRESHMEN PLAYING

- Carolina played 21 freshmen (11 redshirt, 10 true) in the season opening win over James Madison. The 10 true freshmen included WR T.J. Thorpe, CB Tim Scott, LB Travis Hughes, P Thomas Hibbard, S Brandon Ellerbe, LB Norkeithus Otis, DT Devonte Brown, TE Jack Tabb, TE Eric Ebron and DT Shawn Underwood.

CAROLINA NAMES THREE SEASON CAPTAINS

• Head coach Everett Withers named senior center Cam Holland (offense), junior linebacker Kevin Reddick (defense) and senior place-kicker (Casey Barth) captains for the 2011 season. A fourth game captain will be selected each week during the year. Holland is a three-year starter who is a candidate for the Rimington Award (nation's top center). Reddick has led the team each of the last two years in tackles and is a candidate for the Butkus Award (nation's top linebacker). Barth is closing in on the UNC career mark for field goals (needs five) and is the ACC active leader with 50.

• **Game Captains:** Matt Merletti (JMU), Jonathan Cooper (Rutgers), Pete Mangum (Virginia), Dion Guy (Georgia Tech), Quinton Coples (ECU)

HOUSTON BACK FOR 2011

• Senior Ryan Houston is one of three tailbacks employed this year by the Tar Heels, who lost all three of their top runners from a year ago (Johnny White, Shaun Draughn, Anthony Elzy).

• Houston, a native of Charlotte, N.C., redshirted last year. He was cleared in the NCAA/UNC investigation just before the sixth game of the season and elected to redshirt and return this year. He has scored 20 touchdowns in his last 30 games. He is in second place among all returning ACC runners in career touchdowns with 21. He rushed for a team-best 713 yards on 191 carries and scored nine touchdowns in 2009. Houston fractured his right scapula in Carolina's spring game in April. The injury required surgery and Houston was limited to non-contact drills during most of fall training camp.

• Houston has scored 21 rushing touchdowns in his career and his longest scoring run was a 7-yarder vs. Georgia Southern. He has rushed for a combined 51 yards on his 21 touchdowns (2.4 avg.), including nine 10-yard TD rushes.

BLUE GETS HIS OPPORTUNITY

• Sophomore A.J. Blue, who played in six games and had 33 yards rushing as a wildcat quarterback in 2009, is another option at tailback this season. He tore his ACL in 2009 vs. Georgia Southern and redshirted last year.

• Blue saw his most extensive action of the season in the win over Virginia, rushing nine times for 40 yards. He also attempted a pass in the second quarter, just missing on a long play to Jheranie Boyd.

STRENGTH ON THE O-LINE

• Most observers consider Carolina's strength this season to be on the offensive line where the Tar Heels return three starters, including senior center Cam Holland, junior guard Jonathan Cooper and sophomore tackle James Hurst. Those three have combined for 69 career starts. Junior guard Travis Bond (9 career starts) and junior Brennan Williams (6) are also seasoned veterans. Senior Carl Gaskins has also seen extensive playing time this year.

• Cooper was an All-ACC selection last year and was named to the Lombardi Award watch list. Hurst was a freshman All-America by several publications in 2010 and may be the best of the five.

INTERCEPTING PASSES

• Carolina has intercepted 63 passes over the last four seasons (20 in 2008, 19 in 2009, 19 in 2010, 5 in 2011). The school record for interceptions is 21.

• UNC did not pick off its first pass of the 2011 season until the third game of the year vs. Virginia when safety Matt Merletti intercepted two.

BARTH STAYS CONSISTENT

• Place-kicker Casey Barth is one of the most consistent kickers in the country. He has made 51 of 63 career field goal attempts and a school-record 82 consecutive extra points. Barth needs just four field goals to surpass his brother Connor's school-record total of 54.

• Barth owns the school record for most consecutive extra points made (currently at 82). He has not missed an extra point since the season opener vs. The Citadel in 2009. He has the highest percentage of made extra points in school history.

• Last year, Barth earned honorable mention All-ACC honors after converting 19 of 22 field goal attempts, including a long of 49. He made all 38 extra point attempts.

• Barth is the ACC active leader in career field goals with 51.

• Barth has missed each of the last two games with a groin strain.

JONES PICKS UP WHERE HE LEFT OFF

• Senior wide receiver Dwight Jones ranks fifth in the ACC and 23rd in the country with 102.8 receiving yards per game. The Burlington, N.C., native has scored in all four of five games this year.

• Jones had six catches for 93 yards and two touchdowns in the win at ECU. He now has six scores

on the season, which is two more than his career total entering 2011. He is tied for 10th at UNC in single-season touchdown receptions with five others.

- Jones caught nine passes for 116 yards and two touchdowns in the opener vs. JMU. It was the second two-touchdown game of his career (also at Virginia in 2010). The outing came just one day after the birth of his son in Burlington.
- Jones finished with six catches for 135 yards and a 66-yard touchdown against Rutgers. It was his second 100-yard game in as many weeks and the sixth of his career.
- Jones had a breakout season a year ago with 62 receptions and 946 receiving yards, which ranked as the fifth-best single-season marks in school history. He had 198 yards in a win at Virginia and 233 in a win at Florida State.

TAR HEELS PLAYING THEIR 121st FOOTBALL SEASON

- Carolina kicked off its 121st football season in 2011. The Tar Heels boast an all-time record of 668-494-54.
- Carolina is looking to build on three consecutive eight-win seasons. The Tar Heels have appeared in three straight bowl games for the first time since the 1990s.

CAROLINA SETS TEAM RECORD IN WIN OVER JMU

- Carolina set an ACC team record for pass completion percentage in a game for a team with at least 15 attempts. The Tar Heels completed 22 of 23 attempts (.957) – all by QB Bryn Renner. The previous ACC record was .938 by Duke against Georgia Tech in 1960 (15 of 16).

SEVERAL TAR HEELS ON NATIONAL AWARD LISTS

- North Carolina is well represented on the National Award watch lists released during the pre-season. All-America candidate Quinton Coples headlines the list. Considered by many draft experts to be among the top 15 prospects in the country, Coples is a candidate for the Walter Camp Award (nation's top overall player), Bednarik Award (top defensive player), Lombardi Trophy (top lineman), Nagurski Award (top defensive player) and the Hendricks Award (top defensive end). Other Tar Heels named to preseason watch lists include Cam Holland (Rimington - top center), Dwight Jones (Bilitnikoff - top wide receiver), Casey Barth (Groza - top place-kicker), Tydreke Powell (Outland - top interior lineman; Nagurski - top defensive player; Lombardi - top lineman), Donte Paige-Moss (Bednarik - top defensive player, Nagurski - top defensive player; Lombardi - top lineman; Hendricks Award - top defensive end), Jonathan Cooper (Lombardi - top lineman), Zach Brown (Nagurski - top defensive player; Butkus - top linebacker), Kevin Reddick (Butkus - top linebacker; Bednarik - top defensive player), Matt Merletti (AFCA Good Works Team nominee).

COPLES, JONES, POWELL NAMED PRESEASON ALL-ACC

Seniors Quinton Coples, Dwight Jones and Tydreke Powell were named to the 2011 Preseason All-ACC Football team in voting conducted by the media at the annual ACC Football Kickoff, which was held July 24-25 at the Pinehurst Resort in Pinehurst, N.C.

Coples earned first-team All-ACC honors last season at defensive tackle where he posted 59 tackles, 15.5 tackles for losses and 10.0 sacks. A native of Kinston, N.C., he ranked third in the league and 16th in the country in sacks per game. He will return to his natural position of defensive end this fall.

Jones, a native of Burlington, N.C., led the Tar Heels with 62 receptions for 946 yards in 2010. He earned honorable-mention All-ACC honors after finishing fourth in the league with 72.8 receiving yards per game. Jones had four 100-yard receiving games, including a career-best 233 yards in the win at Florida State.

Powell, a native of Ahoskie, N.C., served as a team captain last year and was one of just two defensive players to start all 13 games. He finished the season with 47 tackles and 2.5 sacks. He has been named to the Outland Trophy, Nagurski Award and Lombardi Trophy watch lists.

CHANGE IN THE ANNOUNCE BOOTH

- For the first time in 40 years, Carolina fans will hear a new voice as the play-by-play announcer for the Tar Heel Sports Radio Network in 2011. Jones Angell, who has been a part of the THSN for 11 years, was hired to replace Woody Durham, the long-time voice of the Tar Heels who retired in April. Angell is a native of Jacksonville, N.C., and has worked in a number of roles at the network, including calling play-by-play for Carolina baseball the past eight seasons, which included five trips to the College World Series. He also has served as host and color analyst for football and men's basketball games for the last six years. Angell is a 2001 UNC graduate.

House, a native of Wilmington, N.C., is entering his third year as the Tar Heels' starting deep snapper. Jones, a native of Roanoke Rapids, N.C., has served as Carolina's holder for the past two seasons. He made a great catch and hold on Casey Barth's game-winning field goal at Virginia Tech in 2009. He also returned punts in 2008.

A junior from Raleigh, N.C., Mangum played in every game in 2010 and was named the team's special teams MVP. He joined the team in 2008. Kolojechick, a native of Plymouth, Pa., played in eight games, primarily on special teams, in 2010. He joined the team in 2009. His sister, Kelse, plays on the UNC field hockey team. A junior from Durham, Curry joined the team in 2008.

Jenest, a native of Davidson, N.C., joined the team in 2008 and has played on both the offensive and defensive lines. He played in four games last year, including the Music City Bowl. HANBURGER NAMED CAROLINA'S ACC LEGEND

Professional Football Hall of Famer Chris Hanburger has been named Carolina's 2011 Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game Legend. The Legends (one from each school) will be honored at this year's Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game weekend. They will be honored at the ACC Night of Legends event on Friday, Dec. 2, and during ceremonies at Bank of America Stadium for the 7th Annual Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship, which has an 8 p.m. kickoff on Dec. 3 and will be nationally televised by ESPN in both HD and 3-D.

Hanburger (1962-64), was a standout linebacker and center for the North Carolina teams of coach Jim Hickey in the early-to-mid 1960s. Named a first-team All-ACC selection as a center in both 1963 and 1964, he helped lead the 1963 Tar Heel team to a 9-2 record, a share of the ACC championship and a 35-0 win over Air Force in the Gator Bowl. Drafted on the 18th round of the 1965 NFL Draft by the Washington Redskins, Hanburger went on to play 14 seasons in Washington, where he earned nine Pro Bowl selections and was regarded as one of the best outside linebackers of his era. Inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in August at Canton, Ohio, he played in 187 NFL games and was voted to the All-NFL team four times. A mainstay of the dominant Washington Redskin teams of the 1970s, he made 19 career interceptions, returning them for 347 yards and two touchdowns. He led Washington to the 1972 NFC Championship and Super Bowl VII. That year, he was named the NFC Defensive Player of the Year. Originally a native of Fort Bragg in Fayetteville, N.C., he now lives in Darlington, S.C.



Everett Withers Interim Head Coach Fourth Season at UNC

Charlotte native Everett Withers was promoted to interim head coach on July 28, 2011. Withers is in his 24th season as a coach and has experience at both the professional and college level. He has served as Carolina's defensive coordinator and secondary coach the last three seasons.

Decimated by personnel losses and injuries in 2010, Carolina's defense still ranked fourth in the ACC and 30th in the country as the Tar Heels played with a new lineup virtually every week. Defensive tackle Quinton Coples earned first-team All-ACC honors and linebacker Bruce Carter was a second-team pick. Following the season, five Tar Heel defensive players were taken in the NFL Draft, including first-round selection Robert Quinn, who missed all of the 2010 season.

In addition to his duties as the coordinator, Withers oversees the defensive secondary, which has developed into one of the best units in the country. Carolina picked off 19 passes in 2010 to match the previous year's total, and has 58 interceptions over the past three seasons. Safety Da'Norris Searcy, a fifth-round pick by Buffalo, led the team with four interceptions in 2010.

In 2009, the Tar Heels' defense was among the nation's elite, ranking sixth in total defense, 10th against the run, 13th in scoring defense and 14th in pass defense. Carolina was the only school in the country ranked in the top 15 in total yards allowed, scoring defense, run defense, pass defense, pass efficiency defense, third-down defense and tackles for losses. Six Carolina defenders were named all-conference, including first-team picks Quinn, Quan Sturdivant, Kendrick Burney and Deunta Williams. Carolina had 19 interceptions and set a single-season ACC record with 508 interception return yards. Withers was nominated in 2009 for the Broyles Award, which is presented annually to the nation's top assistant coach.

In 2008, the opportunistic Tar Heel defense ranked eighth in the country with 20 interceptions, just one shy of the school record.

Withers came to North Carolina after serving one season as the University of Minnesota's defensive coordinator in 2007.

Withers spent six seasons with the Tennessee Titans from 2001-06 under head coach Jeff Fisher. From 2002-04, Withers helped the Titans defense tally 57 interceptions, which was the most for the franchise over a three-year period since 1993-95. The 57 interceptions also ranked fourth in the AFC and eighth overall during that time. The Titans totaled 21 picks in 2004, including 16 by the secondary.

In 2002, Withers directed a revamped secondary that added safeties Lance Schulters and rookie Tank Williams. The new arrangement helped the defense earn a top 10 ranking and Schulters' six interceptions were the most by a Titans safety since 1993. Withers also developed Andre Dyson into a starter as a rookie in 2001 and helped him total 16 interceptions during his four-year Titan career, including six in his final season.

Prior to working with the Titans, Withers was defensive backs coach under Mack Brown at Texas from 1998-2000.

Withers joined the Longhorns after three seasons (1995-97) as defensive coordinator at Louisville. While at Louisville, Withers helped current New York Giants All-Pro cornerback Sam Madison earn All-America honors for the Cardinals.

Withers' first National Football League experience came with the New Orleans Saints where he worked as defensive quality control in 1994. Prior to his experience with the Saints, Withers was defensive backs coach at Southern Mississippi for two seasons (1992-93) and outside linebackers coach at Tulane in 1991. The first three years of Withers' coaching career came at Austin Peay, where he was defensive coordinator (1988-89) and special teams/wide receivers coach (1990).

Withers earned his bachelor's degree from Appalachian State in 1985. He was also a standout defensive back and captain for the Mountaineers from 1981-85. Withers and his wife, Kara, have two children, Tia and Pierce.
